

Training Institution numbering system is as follows:

1. The root number is the institution's license number assigned by the State such as 1008
2. The second number code is two digits and identifies the year in which the training began. For example if a class began in January of 2015 the code would read "15".
3. The third number code has one or two letters, and three digits that is a sequential number beginning with 001. The letters signify what type of course:
 - "R" equals emergency medical responder initial course,
 - "ET" equals EMT initial course,
 - "A" equals AEMT initial course,
 - "P" equals Paramedic initial course,
 - "D" equals emergency medical dispatch initial course,
 - "DR" equals emergency medical dispatch refresher course,
 - "T" equals instructor coordinator initial course,
 - "TR" equals instructor coordinator refresher course,
 - "V" equals emergency vehicle operator initial course, and
 - "VR" equals emergency vehicle operator refresher course.

Example for an EMT course would be: 1008-15-ET001
