**RE:** Injectable Epinephrine/Adrenalin Enhanced Module

The North Department of Health Division of Emergency Medical Systems is releasing the injectable epinephrine/adrenalin enhanced module on November 7, 2018.

The course authorization form will be available on our website on November 7, 2018.

An ambulance service wishing to train their EMRs, EMTs and AEMTs in this skill must submit a class authorization signed by their medical director on record to North Dakota Department of Health Division of Emergency Medical Systems two weeks prior to the scheduled training. The medical director will choose the appropriate knowledgeable instructor for this enhanced skill module (MD, Advanced Practice Provider, RN or NRP). The ambulance service must have a written protocol signed by their medical director prior to utilization of this skill.

The certification process consists of a two-hour class consisting of lecture, power point, demonstration, written and practical test check off, which will be available through this office by request.

Following the class completion, a student roster with the signature of the medical director must be submitted to the North Dakota Department of Health Division of Emergency Medical Systems for documentation into the EMS providers training record.

Recertification of this enhanced skill will be every two years.
