Advanced Emergency Medical Technician - AEMT

This EMS Provider level identifies individuals who have successfully completed the Advanced Emergency Medical Technician - AEMT course outlined by the National Registry of Emergency Medical Technicians®. Individuals at this level must have current registration with the Division of Emergency Medical Services (DEMST).

The skills described in this document are only meant to provide guidelines to specific care providers. All skills must be approved by services Medical Director and if necessary additional training be provided by service and monitored by Medical Director.
